

Phrasal Verbs with **be**



be along

Example: The bus will **be along** in a few minutes.

Meaning: The bus will **arrive** in a few minutes.

be around

Example: She **is** always **around** when you need her.

Meaning: She **is** always **present** when you need her.

be in for

Example: You'**re in for** a surprise when she finds out.

Meaning: You'**re in trouble** when she finds out.

be in on

Example: **Were** you **in on** the surprise party plan?

Meaning: **Were** you **participating in** the surprise party plan?

be on about

Example: What **are** you **on about** this time?

Meaning: What **can't** you **stop talking about** this time?

be onto

Example: I think the police **are onto** them.

Meaning: I think the police **suspect** them.

be out for

Example: He'**s out for** revenge.

Meaning: He'**s really eager planning his** revenge.

be up for

Example: I'**m up for** a movie if you are.

Meaning: I'**m willing to** watch a movie if you are.

be up to

Example: The kids are too quiet, what **are** they **up to**?

Meaning: The kids are probably **doing something they shouldn't**.
