AT

get at

imply / suggest / criticize

"His mom keeps getting at him because of his low grades."

INTO

get into

become involved

"I'm getting into martial arts now"

AROUND TO

get around to -ing

find time to do something

"I never got around to replying to their email"

TO

get to

have the opportunity / annoy

"I didn't get to say goodbye to her."

"Don't let his bad mood get to you"

OUT OF

get out of

avoid responsibility

"They got out of doing house chores for the day."

BACK AT

get back at

take revenge

"She got back at him for lying to her."

OVER WITH

get over with

finish something unpleasant

"Let's get over with it fast, I'm tired already."

THROUGH (TO)

get through (to)

succeed in contacting someone

"It's hard to get through to her, she's always in a meeting."
