

The Causative Form

We use it to express arrangements we make, when other people do things for the Subject. It's a form of passive because **the Subject is not the person who does the action**, the Subject caused it.



Subject + **have / get** + **object** + **past participle** + ...

Examples:

She got her car washed yesterday. →

more informal

She paid for a car wash service or someone washed the car for her.

He has his hair cut every two months. →

neutral

He goes to a hairdresser or barbershop every two months, or someone cuts his hair for him every two months.

They will have their house renovated next year. →

neutral

They plan to pay for people to renovate their house next year.

I've finally got my computer fixed. →

more informal

I've finally managed to find someone to fix my computer.
