put away (someone)
imprison

AWAY

"He was put away for 10 years."

() THROUGH

put (something) through
make someone's life difficult

"That factory puts workers through horrible working conditions."

put off

distract / discourage

OFF

"The noise puts me off my work."

"I was put off by his bad manners."

UP ()

put up (something)

show resistance / attach something

"They put up a strong fight."

"They've put up a notice looking for people to help out."

put down (an animal)

euthanize

DOWN ()

"They had to put the dog down, he was too ill."

put down (someone)

criticize / humiliate

DOWN ()

"He often puts people down in meetings."

() UP

put (someone) up

provide accomodation

"I was lucky they put me up for the night, my flight got cancelled."

() UP TO

put (someone) up to

encourage bad behaviour

"Who put you up to this prank? It's not funny."
